Good Old Days Country Shop Relocates to Pultneyville

On August 10th, the shop in Marion closes for ever and the big move begins. We are relocating the business to the former Country Warehouse located on the "V" in Pultneyville. We will be re-opening the doors for business Friday morning, September 12th, at 9:00. We hope to see all of you there for the special re-opening.

We purchased the building this Spring after the winter storms did heavy damage to the east porch. In addition, the whole roof had to be replaced. So we have been working nights and weekends to get this building in tip-top shape. Well, maybe not tip-top, but certainly a lot better than it was.

As some of you might remember,



this building was used for 19 years as a country shop known as The Country Warehouse. The business closed down over 5 years ago and for the most part the building remained vacant except for a small office.

Our 1000 square foot shop in Marion was getting very crowded and we were overflowing into the driveway. This Spring we opened another room but it still wasn't enough room. We have been

looking for a solution to our tight quarters for about a year when we heard the warehouse was up for sale.

This building is a perfect match for our type of business. It has good accessibility to a major highway (Rt.104),

gets plenty of traffic, and already has a good reputation from having a shop in this location for close to 20 years. There is plenty of floor space to grow into as the building is 5000 square feet, just about 5 times larger than our current shop. We plan to open the first floor this Fall and grow into the 2nd floor next year. So we have been very busy collecting some very nice surprises to fill up the space. Won't you visit us in September!

Country shop gets a face-lift

The first order of business was to clean out 20 years of accumulation that had been collecting all these years. This took 3, 20 yard dumpsters and a lot of muscle. Once we got the place cleaned out, we set out to give our shop a new look. Barb is attacking the inside and John is working on the outside.

The exterior is getting painted with a very nice brownish-green

with beige trim and a dark red



accent. We are hoping the weather cooperates and we get

the whole place painted by the opener. But that's not all, we have a few more decorative surprises in store for you just in time for the opener. If we have enough energy left, we will install some colonial street lights out front and a little surprise in the front yard.
